Upcoming Curriculum

Math: In Math we skipped Chp. 2 and are working with Chp. 3. This week in Chp. 3 "Addition" we worked on adding without regrouping and adding with regrouping in the hundreds place. Next week we will practice regrouping in a variety of different places. If the students demonstrate an easy understanding of this skill, then they can plan on having a test Wednesday, September 20th. If we have some that are struggling I will push back the testing date to accommodate the needs of our class.

Reading: The students did a great job working on Theme 2 this week and are good at keeping their questions focused on the main ideas of the text. Over the weekend, have your child review their 5 vocab words, practice asking questions while reading a book of their choice, and locate consonant blends in words they see in their environment (on signs, cereal boxes, newspaper, etc.).

Science: We have been studying water for the last few weeks of science and have learned a lot about surface tension. This week we are finding the mass of a sponge and the water it can soak up. The students love the hands-on exploration!
